

Illnesses that would be easily treated or are uncommon in much of the world continue to cause misery and unnecessary death in vulnerable communities.

World Hope International responds to the scale of the problem by working to strengthen the public health system—alongside clinicians, hospitals, doctors, physical therapists, community health workers, midwives, teachers, health volunteers, medical students, and others—so the most vulnerable will have access to high quality & affordable healthcare and prevention services.

JANET'S STORY

Enable the Children

The goal of World Hope's Enable The Children program is to enable children with disabilities in Sierra Leone to be included, loved, and valued in their families and communities, ensuring a good quality of life. In a country where disability is often seen as a curse, providing access to services that support the overall health and spiritual well-being of children living with disabilities is central to WHI's overall mission to alleviate poverty, suffering and injustice.

Our Enable the Children (ETC) team began seeing Janet in 2016 when she was three months old and unable to control her neck or hold it upright. Although she was provided therapy by the ETC team, Janet continued to struggle to sit, crawl or use her upper limbs. ETC provided her with a corner seat to help her sit independently, and as she grew, the program provided her with a tilted chair and standing frame with supportive shoes so she could learn to stand. With ETC's support and encouragement, exercise, and equipment, Janet started to stand and progressed to walking independently.

HEALING & HOPE: THE RECOVERY CENTRE

Sierra Leone

Julie, a 22-year-old woman, was living with her aging mother and aunt in Freetown. She had desperately wanted to go to university but didn't have the money. A friend offered to do whatever she could to help Julie and connected her with a man who said he could get her a job as a housemaid to earn money for her education.

This man arranged for her to "work" in Oman and prepared her travel documents. Arriving at the airport in Oman she was picked up by an Omani man who introduced himself as her employer.

The next day Julie was woken up at 4 am and was told she had been bought for 2 years. She wanted to reach out to her family, but she had no access to a phone. She worked over 18 hours a day, without pay.

One day while home alone, the husband came into Julie's room and raped her. This continued every night. After about 18 months, she discovered she was pregnant so the husband dumped her miles away from his home. A taxi driver found her and took her in but he also repeatedly raped her.

Through another survivor, Julie was connected with an organization called Do Bold. Do Bold helped her travel back home when she was 6 months pregnant and referred her to World Hope International.

Julie received prenatal care and food support. Regular home visits were done by a counsellor to support her emotionally. She delivered a baby boy a few months after returning home. Julie and her son are doing well. The counsellor and social workers continue to monitor her progress, to offer her the support she may need as she navigates new motherhood and heals from her abuse.

GLEAN WATER & ENGESWAMP WATER

How nearby access to clean water is life-changing

Dirty water affects the health and safety of millions of children. Mariama is 10 years old and dreams of becoming a nurse one day. The community where she lives didn't have access to clean water so people would fetch their water from a nearby swamp for laundry, bathing, and drinking. People would often get sick with cholera and other water-borne diseases.

In 2022, World Hope International, drilled a deep-borehole well and installed a water pump in Mariama's community and now she fetches water in the morning to bath and drink before going to school. Having nearby access to clean water means Mariama doesn't get sick from the water she drinks. It means she has more time to study since she doesn't have to walk far to collect water. It means she is less vulnerable to people who might want to attack or abuse her because she no longer has to travel
