

SAVING LIVES, RESTORING HOPE

Medical Distribution in Rural Liberia

In a clinic in Northeast Liberia, a pregnant woman and her family found hope.

“We had a pregnant woman arrive in critical condition,” the Officer in Charge recalls. “Her hemoglobin levels had dropped dangerously low and she was severely anemic. We were preparing to refer her to a larger health center, which is quite far from here and difficult for many in our community to reach.”

With limited time and few options, the team made a crucial decision: to place the patient on a prenatal BRD (blood-restorative) monitor and administer prenatal supplements provided by WHI.

They monitored her condition for a week.

“Miraculously, she began to recover, faster and better than we expected. Her strength returned, her vitals stabilized, and we didn’t have to refer her after all. The prenatal intervention closed a critical medical gap that many pregnant women here face.”

Thanks to the availability of prenatal support, women are now more motivated to visit the clinic. “When women see that we have what they need: prenatal assistance, prescriptions, and care that works, they come. And they keep coming.” Access to the right medicine and equipment is transforming lives and rebuilding trust in rural healthcare.

A DROP OF HOPE

My name is Assanatu, and I am a student at Royema Junior Secondary School. I live in a small village in Sierra Leone.

Before the well came to our community, I had to wake up very early around 6 a.m., sometimes even before the sun came up, to walk a long distance, over 1.5 KMs to collect water with my siblings. The journey was tiring because the place where we usually collected water was up a hill. The water wasn't always clean. It often had leaves, frogs, and dead insects in it.


By the time I got back home, I was already late for school, and I often missed the devotion session. Sometimes, I didn't go at all. But everything changed when World Hope International (Canada) and The Wesleyan Church built a well in our village.

Now, the well is just a short walk from our house. The water is clean and safe. I no longer spend hours carrying heavy buckets up and down the hill. Thanks to having access to clean water, I can get ready for school on time. I don't worry about snake bites anymore. Now, I wear a clean uniform to school, and I even have enough time to study. Because of this well, I arrive at school early, and I pay better attention because I'm not so tired.

Thank you, World Hope International Canada and The Wesleyan Church, for giving us clean water. With all my heart, thank you.

A SUCCESSFUL SCHOOL YEAR AGAINST ALL ODDS

In Haiti, the school year typically begins in September and ends in June. But for more than five years, political unrest and mounting insecurity have severely disrupted this rhythm, drastically reducing classroom days. In 2024, the school year didn't start until October—and even then, many families lacked the means to send their children back to school.



UNICEF reports a 70% surge in child recruitment by armed groups. Today, children—some as young as eight—make up nearly half of these groups. Denied access to education, they face growing risks of exploitation and violence. Education remains one of the few powerful tools to break this cycle.

Thanks to the unwavering generosity of our donors, over 500 children were able to attend partner schools this year. They received uniforms and school supplies—simple yet essential items that make it possible for a child to attend school with dignity.

Despite the instability, all our schools successfully completed the academic year. **Twenty sponsored students passed the national exams to enter secondary school.** More than 500 children finished the school year safely, even as waves of violence and gang attacks threatened to derail their progress.

As Nelson Mandela said, “Education is the most powerful weapon we can use to change the world.” We believe that wholeheartedly. That’s why we remain committed to investing in education—to transform the lives of children, their families, and the future of Haiti.

FINDING HOPE IN THE MIDST OF HARDSHIP

Ongoing conflict in Haiti means that many continue to suffer. According to the United Nations (UN), more than 702,000 people have been displaced, and nearly 5 million people are facing acute hunger (almost half of the population) with 1.6 million being at risk of starvation.

Denise, a resilient mother of four, faced unimaginable hardship after losing her husband and being forced to flee her home when armed gangs overtook her neighborhood. Once a small shopkeeper selling groceries from her home, Denise lost everything in the chaos. With nowhere else to go, she and her children sought refuge miles away with a distant cousin.

"I arrived with no hope," Denise recalls, tears filling her eyes. "We lived day to day, sometimes going entire days without food. But God heard our prayers."

Her faith was met with relief when she received a food and hygiene kit from our distribution program. "This kit is a divine blessing," she says, smiling faintly. "It will help us get through the next two weeks."

We have received many testimonials of thanks. You responded generously to the suffering of our brothers and sisters in Haiti. This small gesture has saved the lives of thousands of people.
